THE WHY BEFORE THE STORM: For years, the planners coordinating the Rendezvous have worked with the Presidents of the car clubs on the best ways for the cars to keep cruising without their cars over heating (a huge concern of the car owners). That is one of the major reasons there are traffic control volunteers directing traffic during the show. While I was delivering water and lunch to one of the traffic control volunteers, I was told that several car participants were expressing complaints regarding their cars stalling and overheating due to an individual interrupting the cruise to talk to car participants. So, I approached that individual, told him who I was, explained the situation and requested he stop interrupting the cruise and go over to the side walk (a good place for interviewing). His reaction was rude, offensive and when he refused to cooperate, the P.D was asked to intervene, thus the video.

I want to take this time to say San Bernardino always offers us the most spectacular police assistance/protection ever throughout the day and because of that everyone at this event is safe. I also want to thank SB County for loaning us their property in which everyone could enter the show. SB Fire for being so special and helpful, as always. And the Car Participants for turning out and creating a *GREAT* Day in San Bernardino.

Sometimes, hiccups happen, and unfortunately, there are always a few who do not understand or feel these guidelines are necessary and disrrupt the process.
